

Students that graduate from high school and successfully complete the Passport program will receive a scholarship towards their higher education and a Microsoft computer. Over the past several years, nearly 100% of our graduating seniors have gone on to enroll in a two or four year institution, like Standford University, Morehouse College, UCLA, UC Irvine, West Point and Howard University.
